



Lift Truck Operations

A **forklift** (also called *lift truck*, *forklift truck*) is a powered industrial truck used to lift and move materials over short distances

These include Sit down counterbalance, Narrow Aisle, Pallet trucks etc. An operator of a Lift Truck must be **competent** to operate/use such equipment.

The in-class theory segment provides knowledge and understanding of safe inspections and operations of the lift truck and the practical component assesses the skills of the operator to apply their knowledge in the safe operations of the same, thus reducing the risk of harm to people property and business and to increase productivity and efficiency.

Course description:

- Type of Lift trucks
- Pre-operation/shift inspection
- Safe operating procedures
- Theory of operation and stability
- Principals of safe material handling
- Propane Cylinders exchange / Batteries charging and maintenance
- Pedestrian Safety
- Safe operations in special conditions – eg. loading docks

Competent person:

Means a person who, is qualified because of knowledge, training and experience to organize the work and its performance, is familiar with this Act and the regulations that apply to the work, and has knowledge of any potential or actual danger to health or safety in the workplace (*section 1(1) of the OHSA*)

Note:

1. The practical part is a safe operations skills assessment.
2. Practical assessment separate for each class of lift truck.
3. Additional charges apply for more assessment on more than one class.
